

ALICE SPRINGS DESERT PARK

EDUCATION PROGRAMS – NOCTURNAL TOUR

Step inside the Mulga Walk enclosure for an evening of adventure and discovery. Spotlight endangered and extinct animals no longer found in Central Australian deserts including mala and bilby in the foothills of the MacDonnell Ranges. Students will learn about endangered species of the desert and how they can make a difference.

- A chance to see rare and endangered animals.
- Learn about predators and threats to native animals.
- Explore nocturnal life of mammal species.

Handy hints:

- Cameras are welcome but no flash photography please.
- Wear sturdy walking shoes; bring water, insect repellent (optional) and warm clothes in winter.



Departure

A Nocturnal Tour group booking requires a minimum of 15 and maximum of 45 people. Available Monday to Friday with a 7.30pm departure for the Desert Park courtyard. Transfers are not included.

Inclusions

A one hour spotlighting experience with an expert guide followed by a warm hot chocolate and biscuit. A chance to see rare and endangered animals. Includes the use of a head torch for the tour. On arrival a Park Guide will provide a complimentary meet and greet with brief introduction to the Desert Park including behaviour expectations.
